FOR PARENTS OF PRE SCHOOL STUDENTS

We are dedicated to providing the highest-quality preschool education in a secure, nurturing, and stimulating environment. Our age-appropriate curriculum and ongoing communication with parents address the physical, emotional, and intellectual needs of our preschool students.

During the first few weeks of classes, we focus on helping students become comfortable with the dance experience, their classroom, teacher, and classmates. Through age-appropriate music, stretching exercises, ballet and tap basics, and creative games, we foster coordination, listening skills, musical awareness, and imagination. Remember, preschool dance is about helping children tap into their imaginations and express themselves creatively, while also learning steps. So don't worry if your child doesn't pirouette around the house right away—it's all part of their dance journey.

The process of separating from parents is an important milestone for preschool children attending dance class. As children grow, they learn to develop an interest in class activities, feel comfortable with their peers, and understand that parents will always come back for them. We understand that some children may initially resist attending class, but it's usually short-lived. Here are some helpful suggestions:

- Focus on the positive aspects of the dance class experience.
- Ensure your child is engaged in an activity or under the teacher's care before you leave.
- Keep goodbyes brief and avoid prolonged farewells.
- Seek assistance from the teacher during the separation process. Remember, any tears shed are often for the parent's benefit.

Please remember to take your student to the bathroom befor class to avoid your child having to go during class. It seems as though when one student needs to go, they all need to go.



UNDERSTANDING DANCE EDUCATION

As a parent, your support is invaluable to your child's dance journey. Encourage them to be the best version of themselves, focusing on their own accomplishments rather than comparing themselves to others. Dance is an individual art form, and each student progresses at their own pace. Our dedicated faculty not only teaches technique and steps but also imparts essential life lessons. Through dance, children learn commitment, teamwork, and the rewards of hard work. Our goal is to educate their minds, bodies, and souls, providing them with skills that will serve them well in all aspects of life.



Class Placement

Encourage your child to celebrate their achievements and avoid speaking negatively about teachers, fellow students, or other parents. Our faculty takes their role as mentors seriously, guiding students to act respectfully towards their peers, adults, and themselves. If you have questions or concerns, please reach out directly to your child's teacher or the director. Misinformation can be avoided by seeking accurate information from the right sources.



STAYING INFORMED

DRESS CODE

At Stompin' Beatz, our dress code is designed to foster focus, inclusiveness, and equality among all dancers. By adhering to requested dress-wear (leotard, tights, biker shorts, ballet skirt), we create an environment where teachers can assess technique, alignment, and other crucial aspects of dance training effectively. Let's embrace the dress code with confidence and unity!

To ensure organization, students are required to carry their dance-wear, shoes, and belongings in a designated dance bag. Please remember to label your child's bag and all its contents with their name. Let's keep our dance-wear in excellent condition by regularly laundering and maintaining it.

During classes, we kindly request that students avoid wearing watches, jewelry, and safety pins, as they can be distracting. Dance shoes should never be worn outside to preserve their quality and cleanliness. Female students are encouraged to secure their hair tightly and neatly away from their faces. Maintaining good personal hygiene habits, including the use of deodorant for students aged 10 & older, is expected from all dancers.

REGISTRATION FEE & TUITION

To ensure smooth operations and provide necessary coverage for insurance and administration, we have an annual registration fee. The fee is \$35 for single students and \$20 each additional family member. It's a small investment that helps us create an amazing dance experience for everyone. Please note that registration fees are non-refundable.

When it comes to tuition, we want to make it as convenient as possible for you. Monthly tuition is taken out by autopay from the card on file on the 1st of every month. Please be sure to update the card on file if your card on file expires, is compromised, or you would just like to use a different card. This can be updated on your Dance Studio Pro account that was set up on the day you registered. Tuition rates and payments are based on Nine Installments and are not affected by the specific number of classes that meet during any given month. For example: some months have 5 classes, some months have 3; monthly tuition is always the same. There are no refunds or reductions given based on holidays, vacations or absences. If account is delinquent for 60 or more days, the account will be turned over to a collection agency. Parents are responsible for any and all collections cos¹². The contraction of the contracti

TERMINATING DANCE CLASSES:

If you would like to remove a class, or completely terminate dance classes, you MUST go to our webpage and fill out the "Terminating Dance Class" form. This is to remove yourself from any financial obligation. Phone calls will not be accepted. We must receive your intentions to stop class/classes by the 25th of each month. If the studio isn't notified and the payment is processed you are still committed to the next month. Refunds will not be given. The tuition is based on enrollment (guaranteed spot in class) and not class attendance and participation. A drop fee will be charged of \$35

DISCIPLINE POLICY



At Stompin' Beatz, we believe in creating a positive, nurturing, and professional environment for all our students. We emphasize the importance of being part of a group, respecting others, our teachers and staff, and the studio property. Our goal is to foster good habits and cultivate a culture of compliance with rules of conduct.

Our staff and faculty are trained in constructive techniques of discipline to maintain class control and address individual misbehavior effectively. When a child exhibits unacceptable behavior or attitudes, we take a proactive approach. We kindly explain what went wrong and guide them towards a positive alternative approach or behavior.

In the event of a conflict between children, we handle the situation respectfully. They are separated and encouraged to express what happened. We promote problem-solving and communication between them to find a resolution and reconcile with one another.

Disruptive behavior is addressed in a respectful manner. If a child's behavior continues to disrupt the class, we kindly ask them to stop. Should the disruption persist, a reminder will be given, highlighting how it affects others. If necessary, the children involved may be asked to take a short break (typically three to five minutes) before rejoining the class.

If a child's misbehavior persists and continues to significantly disrupt the class, we may need to involve the parent or guardian. We believe in open communication and will reach out to discuss the situation and request the child to be picked up if necessary. Please remember that our ultimate goal is to provide a safe and productive environment for all students.

ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE

At Stompin' Beatz, we value punctuality and safety for all our students. We kindly ask students to arrive 5-10 minutes before their class begins, allowing them to settle in and prepare for an amazing dance experience. To ensure the safety of our young dancers, all children must be picked up in the lobby as we do not allow the children to walk out of the building without an adult. In the event you are running late or parking is tight, we will take the student back to their classroom so we can look after them and ensure they are taken care of.

We understand that unforeseen circumstances or emergencies may arise, causing delays. If you find yourself in such a situation, please call 314-698-3976 or contact in a private chat on the students class Band app. Our priority is to keep your child calm and safe until they can be collected. Your communication is crucial, and we appreciate your cooperation.

ATTENDANCE

Every class at Stompin' Beatz is a step forward in the educational journey of our students. Regular attendance is essential for continuous progress and growth. During the season, technique and choreography for the year-end performance will be taught and rehearsed. It's crucial for children to feel completely confident with the choreography and their performance. Missing classes during this period could lead to frustration for the students, their teachers, and their classmates. We encourage all students to prioritize their dance education and make attending classes a top priority.

TARDINESS

Dance is a physical activity that requires a properly warmed-up body to ensure safe movement execution. Students who arrive late miss out on the essential warm-up and/or barre exercises, which may increase the risk of injury. We want all our dancers to enjoy their dance journey while staying safe and injury-free.

CLASS VISITORS:

For the safety of our students and to fulfill our legal responsibilities, we are unable to permit visitors in the classroom during regular class sessions. Students should refrain from inviting siblings, relatives, or friends to their classes, except for special events such as "Bring a Friend Week" and in-studio performances where families are invited in. These occasions offer a unique opportunity for sharing the joy of dance with loved ones.



MAKEUP CLASSES:

We understand that unforeseen circumstances may cause a student to miss a class. To ensure they don't miss out on the valuable learning experience, we offer the opportunity to make up the missed class with a similar one. Please reach out to the office, and our team will guide you in determining the best makeup class for your child.

SNOW DAYS & STUDIO CLOSINGS:

If the public schools are closed, please do not assume the studio is as well. An email or text will be sent out at least one hour before the start of classes. We also try to get the closing posted on Fox 2 news. There will be no refunds for missed classes due to weather related or state or local mandated cancellations, and make-up classes are encouraged in your childs same age level/different subject or different age level/same subject class.

LOST AND FOUND:

We know how easy it is for dance-wear, shoes, and personal items to get misplaced. To avoid any confusion, please make sure to label all your child's belongings with their name. We will make every effort to locate and return lost items; however, we kindly ask for your understanding that we cannot be held responsible for any items your child brings to class.

EMERGENCY EVACUATION:

While we have never experienced an emergency evacuation at our studio, we prioritize preparedness and the safety of our students and staff. Emergency evacuation routes are clearly posted throughout the studio and reception area. In the event of an emergency, students will calmly and quietly evacuate in single file to the designated area. Our dedicated teachers will take attendance to ensure everyone's safety. Students and teachers will return to the building only when the all-clear signal is given, indicating that it is safe to do so.



ILLNESS:

The health and well-being of our students and staff are of utmost importance to us. We kindly request your cooperation in keeping our dance community healthy. If your child exhibits any of the following symptoms, we kindly ask that you keep them at home to prevent the spread of illness:

- Nasal discharge that is green or yellow
- Complaints of ear pain
- Consistent cough
- Severe sore throat
- Pink, burning, itching, or discharging eyes
- Diarrhea or vomiting
- Fever

If these symptoms or any other contagious conditions are observed in your child during a class, we will promptly contact you to arrange for their immediate pick-up. When your child has a fever, please keep them at home until their temperature returns to normal. Furthermore, if there are any lingering signs of illness such as glassy or watery eyes, listlessness, or drowsiness, we kindly request that you keep your child at home. This precaution will ensure that the illness has fully passed, and your child will be well enough to fully participate in class activities the following week.

CAR PARK SAFETY:

At Stompin' Beatz, the safety of our dance family is our top priority. When entering and exiting our parking lot or utilizing on-street parking, we kindly ask everyone to exercise extreme caution. Please be mindful of the presence of children of all ages. It is essential to park only in designated parking spaces and avoid parking in areas that are not intended for vehicles. Additionally, we kindly request that you refrain from idling your car if parked in close proximity to the building or its windows. For the safety of all, we kindly ask that siblings do not play in the parking lot. Let's create a safe and secure environment for everyone to enjoy.
